I got 12 pag letters from Dr. Lecher came describing the typhoon at Kitagang. Other letters came from Mr. Carson and Mr. Wallace, giving more horrible details. Whole villages wiped away - a few trees left out of a thousand - three left out of a household of twenty or etc. etc.

We shall send Mr. Lecher's letter. Our cook's note as that compound walls were down, people badly injured - babies suffocated, bathhouse blown ¹⁸⁷² etc. etc.

I & I took John to the little
hill. "the little round one"
where he has been sitting legs
for weeks. Then I & I went
up to see Ben, who had sent
for us to talk our affairs, as
he planned to leave Saturday
for Chaochowpa.

shown made us have it inside
instead of out. A very
pleasant time, but I was
beginning to feel worse,
and after we had exchanged
the news of latest letter which
arrived while we were there we
came home early.

I asked me to come see

Miss Bass and have tea.
which I did. Then Mr. Nelson
stayed with me until I found
Ellie, looking in my rain coat.
