**background**

In 1870, Isabella Thoburn opened a small school in Lucknow, India. Through the support of the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church, her educational program grew and became Lucknow Women's College in 1886. Isabella Thoburn died of cholera in 1901 and the college was named Isabella Thoburn College in her memory in 1903. It later was incorporated as the woman's college of Lucknow University.
