background

The Friends Historical Collection, located in Hege Library at Guilford College, is the center for the study of Quaker history in the Southeast, with particular emphasis on North Carolina. The collection includes the written records of Carolina Friends from 1680 to the present, printed and microfilmed copies of other Friends records, personal and family papers, the college archives, printed materials by and about Friends worldwide, and sources for the study of Quaker family history. North Carolina Friends have officially served as missionaries in several countries, including one individual in India. Several North Carolina Friends served in Cuba and in Palestine over the years so work in these areas is better documented through original documents and photographs in the Friends Historical Collection.

access/use restrictions

The collection is open to Guilford students and faculty, Friends, visiting scholars, and genealogical researchers. Appointments are encouraged for researchers wishing to consult manuscript collections. Most published holdings, including specialized serials, are available whenever the college library is open.
