32. PLEASE TELL BRIEFLY ABOUT ANY UNUSUAL EXPERIENCES YOU HAVE HAD - FOR EXAMPLE: WERE YOU INTERNED, CAPTURED, BOMBED, ETC? THESE EXPERIENCES NEED NOT BE LIMITED TO MILITARY ACTIVITIES. As soon as the Sino-Japanese War broke out I went to Kweiyang, Kweichow Province, to help reestablish the Great China University during the winter of 1937. In the summer of 1938 I was sent back to Shanghai by the said university to take charge of its branch acting as president. Under the pressure of the Japanese occupation force and the puppet Nanking Government I managed to maintain the university under my charge a loyal institution to Chungking Government, and sent many trained graduates to the interior to work for the war against the enemy. I also managed to keep a group of loyal professors together, giving them a chance to maintain a decent living for themselves and their families, in order to keep them from joining puppet institutions. Hundreds of students therefore had the opportunity to study in a loyal university, and to keep themselves from the evil influence of the enemy.

Somehow I myself managed not to participate in any organization sponsored by the enemy or the puppets even under duress. One of my old classmates who willingly collaborated with the enemy tried very hard to win me over to his side by persuasion and by threats. But all his efforts were of no avail. Sometime in 1940 a freshman student of our university who proved to be an agent of the enemy was murdered on the staircase of our university premises by some mysterious person. This incident angered the puppet Nanking Government which decided to hold me responsible for the murder and sent the Satanic Li Shi-Chung to Shanghai to arrest me for torturous trial in the notorious No.76 Jessfield Road. Again miraculously I was not put under arrest. Another student of our economical department who also proved to be of the same colour threatened me with a pistol because I refused to let him graduate on account of his poor

academic record. Since I was not afraid to be murdered for doing my duty, he changed his mind not to shoot me. Now I can tell many instances similar to these unpleasant experiences. But it suffices to say that my colleagues and myself underwent a hellish time from the summer of 1938 until the V-J day. We could not move about freely and might be assassinated at any moment. I sincerely believe it is God who has preserved us and has given us strength to carry on as usual.

After the V-J. day our Minister of Education, Dr. Chu Chia-Hwa, showed the government's appreciation for our faithful work during the war in Shanghai by recognizing all the credits of our graduates and undergraduates, and by appointing myself as a member of government commission for the examination of the college and university officials and professors and graduates who remained in the Shanghai Area during the war, so as to reward the loyal and to punish the unloyal according to the law promulgated for this special purpose.

But my office was bombed again and it was on fire. However, we shall build them up again, if there was another bombing.

22) My<sup>2</sup> moved westward with army and our people. Men, Women, children and old folk brought what they had in their hands and lost what they had in their homes and their fields. They moved along the highway. They don't know where they can stay, where they can eat. Their homes burned. What they have had were their parents, their children and the high sky and endless highway. They were experienced in the terrible life of a defense-less country. They were educated to realized the importance of transportation. They were understood the real cooperation and real understanding are the main factors of peace and fortunate of the whole world. At the beginning of the past war, I went to my native place, Kinhwa where I stayed for a couple of days. As my whole family left in Shanghai, I had to come back. I was aboard a bus from my place to the Kinhwa railway Station. Siren was heard just the mid-way and all the passengers hurriedly got off to seek shelter. I saw two farmers slowly hiding themselves under a tree near a river. During that time one Japanese plane was already above our head and definitely the cruel pilots observed the two poor creatures. At first they machine-gunned and after a while dropped two bombs toward the very tree. Fifteen minutes after all was quiet and we hastened to the spot where we saw only the two countrymen's abdomens swollen like a big drum and their heads and limbs were no place to be found. When we arrived at the destination, the railway station had also been badly bombed. I had thus to wait for a whole day in the open without any food to catch a train to return to Shanghai via Hangchow.

We the people of West Chekiang may be called more civilized there in the mountain regions, and consequently we were the more despised and looked down. Anarchy was the order of the day. Theft and robbery became daily occurrences. Seven times I was robbed during four successive years. But in considering the poverty-stricken conditions of the native people there I rather sympathized with them. After eight years of such dreadful life there is still this civil war going on. Is there any heart or soul in it? I was captured by the Japanese once, but I escaped. For three summers in Lishui bombing was a daily occurrence.

When, 1944, the Chinese army retreated from Kueilin, means of transportation were completely disrdreded, I walked on foot about three hundred miles in order to get Chungking, the war capital of China. This was a journey of dirty and exhaustion. But, upon Mercy of God, I got the destination!



On 1942, I went to Chungking, the war Capital of China and joined the China National Aviation Corp. as the secretary of Business Dept. Two years later, I was sent by the Government to the States to study the civil aviation administration. Shortly after I arrived Washington D. C. came the V-J day and the war was over.

When the Sino-Japanese War broke out, I was working in Nanking while my mother and other family members were living in Wusih, a city about 50 miles from the war front Shanghai. With the gradual intensity of war situation, I was ordered to evacuate from Nanking to inner land. So before I left Nanking, one day I took train back to Wusih to visit my mother and intended to move them to some safe place. I arrived Wusih at midnight. I spent that night in a big hotel near railway station. Next day, I was surprised to find out that I was the only customer with one waiter in that hotel. I came to home and found the house was empty. In fact most people had evacuated and left only a dead city. Fortunately, I met an old neighbour and <sup>was</sup> told that my mother had moved to a small village near the city. I proceeded on immediately by hiring a risha, a kind of car pulled by the driver without any motorpower. When I arrived the village, it was a dark night-no moonlight and ~~even~~ a single star. I could only find my way by use of my flashlight, while the noise of Japanese planes in the sky broke out the ~~dark~~ <sup>silent</sup> night. Suddenly I found out some people followed me, and in a few minutes I was surrounded by a big crowd. Before I could asked the reason, they captured me and brought me to the office of village government. Then I was told I was arrested under the name of Japanese spy, because I used the flashlight to show the Japanese planes the bombing objectives in the dark night. Since they are un-educated, I tried in vain to explain that I was coming to visit mother and know little about the serious war condition in this village. They sentenced me to death and would execute the ~~next~~ <sup>only</sup> morning. I thought I could/wait for death if no body helped me that night. Fortunately, the news of my arrest spreaded into every home in that village and reached my mother. She immediately came to my place and explained to them all the facts. Finally I was set free.

In May 1940 I joined the A. R. P. Hongkong, and after being trained for a time, became the District Warden. At that time when the Japanese army invaded Hongkong, I was mobilized by the Insular Government to take up the relief work. During that time we were cut off from any connection from our Headquarter for three days and nights under the threat of heavy shells. We had however not deserted our posts until the surrender of the Hongkong government.

In 1941 I became afterwards an underground worker, and helped send secretly all those staffs of the Bank of China to Chungking. Having finished the work, I managed to leave Hongkong under disguise to Chungking where I worked in Dr. T. V. Soong's office. Concurrently I had been for three years the leader of the Air Defense Corporation at Shang Ching Tse, Chungking experiencing all sorts of hardships under Japanese air attacks. After V-J day I flew back to Shanghai, and still am serving in the Bank of China.



In the early morning of the 5th May 1942, a few months after the taking over of the International Settlement by the Japanese, I was awakened by the Japanese gendarmes and was taken to the Japanese Gendarmerie together with my poor wife under no reason known to myself. My house has been carefully searched as if I were a real convict. After the first hearing, I was given to understand that they were looking for a certain Mr. Wu who was very active in supervising the underground workers at that time. As I never knew him during my lifetime, I was unable to give any information regarding him. Thus, they resorted to their brutal punishments which I dared not even to recollect. My wife shared the same experience but, owing to her serious sickness, they released her on the same day. They put me in jail since and, each day, they brought me out for questioning which was certainly accompanied with maltreatments. But, since I couldn't give anything to their satisfaction and seeing that I was really innocent, they set me free after ten days' imprisonment. Although a zealous Christian myself, I couldn't help from hating the Japs whenever the old accounts comes into my recollection. All my hope for now is that my next generations will never experience such in their lifetime!
