Dear Dr. North:

I wish to refer you to my letter of October 7, 1925, in regard to the actions taken by the Executive Committee of the China Medical Board on behalf of the premedical department of Shantung Christian University, particularly to the last paragraph of page 3, which reads as follows:

This amount (Mex. 5,850 for maintenance) the China Medical Board is prepared to meet on condition that the sum of Mex. 6,000 shall be provided directly from the missionary societies instead of a sum of Mex. 6,000 which has been provided from the funds of the Medical School. This sum of Mex. 6,000 should be returned to the Medical School and used for its original purpose. I take it from your letter of October 5 that this condition is agreed to and will be met.

I am informed by Mr. Greene that his arrangement with Dr. MacRae did not include the return of the Mex. 6,000 to the Medical School, but merely proposed the transfer of the amount definitely from the Medical School to the Premedical School without reimbursement of the Medical School. The Executive Committee has, however, taken action with the understanding that this sum of Mex. 6,000 would be provided further from the funds of the missionary board, and you will recall that we had some hesitation before taking this matter up, because the Board of Governors of the University were not prepared to secure any additional funds

The Executive Committee has, however, taken action with the understanding that this sum of Mex. \$,600 would be provided from the funds of the missionary board, and you will recall that we had some hesitation before taking this matter up, because the Board of Governors of the University were not prepared to receive any additional funds.





My dear Miss Eggleston:

I am very grateful to you for your letter of March 4th with reference to the release of Shantung Christian University from the requirement of furnishing a new Mex.\$6,000. to the Medical School in connection with the amount transferred to the premedical courses from funds hitherto received through the Medical School accounts. We appreciate very heartily the adjustment you have made.

I have this statement from Dr. McRae;

"With reference to this Appropriation C.M.2729, it is anticipated that the two new Science teachers will be available as from the spring term February 15, 1926. 

Dear Mr. Greene:

The Board of Governors of Shantung Christian University has given careful consideration to the problem presented to the Medical School of the University by the termination in 1926 of the China Medical Board's annual grant (C.M. 2694), now at the figure of \$49,000.00, to this school. Conversations between yourself, President Balme, and Mr. Cochran have led us to understand that the China Medical Board does not desire to continue the present annual grant but would consider assisting the University in adjusting itself to the situation.

Recognizing that the stability of the important work of the Medical School ought to be more fully protected by the possession of assured sources of income, the Governors have authorized a campaign for endowment for the Medical School and for other needed items in the University's work. Mr. B.A. Carside has been brought to the United States for this purpose and later on President Balme will join him.

It is the plan of the Governors to seek to secure at least the sum of US \$500,000. for the endowment of the Medical School. This, it is estimated, is likely to yield the equivalent of Mex. \$49,000. or better, especially if the low range of silver prices is maintained over a period of years. As the University has not had a campaign for a number of years, the raising of such an amount and sums for other needs of the University will not be an easy task, but we believe that it can be done in spite of the restraint which the present situation in China puts upon the impulses of donors.

The interest and support shown by the China Medical Board to the Medical School and the high degree to which the school is fulfilling the objectives which the China Medical Board is seeking to promote seem to the Governors to justify application, hereby made, by them to the China Medical Board, for one-half (US \$250,000.00) of this endowment. Few medical institutions in China, if any, have enlisted the support of so many mission groups and are supplying physicians and nurses to so many hospitals. There is, however, little need of rehearsing to you

the achievements and quality of the school as the China Medical Board has for so many years stood in the closest relation to it.

Our request for a grant of \$250,000.00 for endowment has point not only in the value of that amount as money to the institution, but as a commendation of the institution to the contributing public before which we must go - a commendation the more valuable in the present disturbed situation. Should the grant be in the form of a conditional gift of a dollar granted for each dollar raised from our constituency it would be helpful we are sure. Such a leverage as this at the beginning of the campaign now opening would go far in encouraging other gifts.

To this request we venture to add another. Even with the most energetic efforts it will be difficult to have the money raised, paid in, and earning the full amount required by the time the present grant ends. We therefore further ask that at the termination of the present grant the China Medical Board, if necessary, join with the University in providing in amount of current funds sufficient with the income of the endowment then in hand to maintain the level of income at Mex. \$49,000.00 pending the securing and collection of the whole of the endowment. This provision we seek for the protection of the work.

Trusting that this application will receive the favorable attention of the China Medical Board at an early date, I am

My dear Mr. Greene:

I have gone over with Mr. Garside the problem to which you referred in your telephone conversation a few days ago as to the embarrassments which the present situation in China produces with reference to appropriations of large capital sums for Shantung University. Our judgment is that no serious harm would be done under the circumstances if the matter goes over until the April meeting of the China Medical Board if you think that this is the wise course. The situation causes us also to draw in our campaigning horns, and we are using the time for more thorough preparation of literature and other material. I doubt whether we will come to grips with any important donors before April.

We certainly hope that the trend of the present situation will not be in the direction of accenting those factors that cause donors to delay or to decline to make contributions, for we believe that the position of the University, barring unexpected, radical developments, is secure with the Chinese and that steady progress on its part in the direction of registration may succeed in keeping us on an even keel in spite of what appear to be high winds ahead.

My dear Mrs. Shaw:

We have received from Mr. Ronald F. Adgie, the Treasurer of the Shantung Christian University in China, request for the payment of the China Medical Board's appropriation C.M. 2694 for the year 1926-1927, or for at least part of the year.

Although the former appropriation for maintenance of Mex. 33,000 a year for four years was paid quarterly in China, this was done only because the appropriation was without conditions. Since the present appropriation is conditioned upon an amount supplied by the Women's Committee, it is necessary for us to have assurance from you that the conditions have been met, before actual payment can be made. Payments which have been made on this appropriation up to this time have been made in the United States, an arrangement which we had understood was agreeable to Shantung Christian University.

Mr. Adgie reported in his letter of December 2 that Mex. 7,730 had then been received from the Women's Committee. You can probably give a more complete statement of just what the Women's Committee has contributed to date. At this time of the year you naturally can not give us a final statement concerning your contributions. However, if it would be a convenience, we could handle this matter as we have other similar ones. We could advance the China Medical Board's full appropriation for the year (Mex. 49,000), subject to adjustment at the end



Dear Dr. North:

Referring to your letters of January 20th and 31st in regard to endowment for the Shantung Christian University, I have consulted with other officers of the Rockefeller Foundation and find that they agree with me that it would be unwise to present any proposal for a contribution to an endowment for a foreign institution in China at the present time. I think you are probably right in the conclusion stated in your later letter as to the postponement of your own campaign. Whether the situation will be substantially different or not in April remains to be seen. I am myself doubtful.

Realizing the need for continuing the work of the institution, if circumstances permit, until the endowment campaign can be started, I am prepared to recommend a contribution towards maintenance for one year to take effect from the expiration of our present appropriation in 1928. Such a temporary appropriation would normally come up for preliminary consideration at our budget meeting in the fall of this year and I should prefer not to ask any definite commitment from the Foundation before that time. Meanwhile Mr. Garside can be





I am enclosing copies of letters sent us by Mr. N. Gist Gee, concerning appropriations to Shantung Christian University, for your information. We hope that the agencies supporting the University will not reduce their contributions so far as to complicate payments of the grants from the Foundation.

I should like to call your attention at this time to appropriation C.M. 2693 of \$30,000.00 for less in exchange. The Foundation's Medical Board's appropriation C.M. 2692 of \$50,000.00 for building and equipment was paid April 28, 1925. As our records indicate that exchange at that time was somewhat over the Mex. 1.00 - \$0.50 rate it would appear that something may be due on less in exchange for this payment. Although exchange is favorable at present, it may be that some loss was suffered by the University during 1926 and 1927 if the funds were used then. Less in exchange is also payable under this appropriation on funds remitted for capital expenditure on the building program approved by the China Medical Board by agencies other than the China Medical Board since November 5, 1924, the date of the action. 
My dear Mrs. Shaw:

Dear Miss Eggleston:

Thank you very much for your letter of May 11th. As to the amount of money I wish to apply for from the Foundation, I do not have any definite idea. I went to see Dr. Frank McLean of the Medical Department and Dr. E. R. Long of the Pathology Department to get some informations about the living expenses and so forth in Germany as both of them have been there not long ago. Judging from what they have told me, it will cost \$1,000 a year for live and about \$500. a year for laboratory fees and tuitions. I heard in Germany they charge quite large for the laboratory fees.

As the arrangement for me to study in Europe is only a recent arrangement, I do not expect to hear from our school yet. It will take two months to get news go and back from China. The only thing I know is that the school will continue my salary as Mex. 100 per month. Shantung Christian University will be responsible for my travel back to China. As to the Mex. 100 I got from the Shantung Christian University is for my family. That sum will be just enough for them to make live there and I shall not be able to take any out of that.

As the condition is different as it was before in China, it will be difficult for the Shantung Christian University to rise their budget for the next year. I think they will be short of money the next year. I am afraid that the Shantung Christian University shall not be able to pay for my travel and tuition. The original plan was that I come and study in this country. It will be an extra money for the Shantung Christian University to pay for my travel from here to Boston and from Boston to Germany.

I do not know how much it will cost from here to Boston and from Boston to Germany. I think you know that very well than I do.

I should like to apply \$1,500 from the Foundation to study one year in Germany besides the travel from here to Boston and from Boston to Germany and the tuition in Boston City Hospital if they should charge.

Please kindly let me know about your final decision of the exact amount of the grant for my study in Boston and Berlin. I have heard from Dr. O'Connor of the Foundation today saying that Dr. Pick in Berlin has agreed to take me to work in his laboratory.



In response to your inquiry as to the present plans of Dr. Peter C. Kiang for next year, I would say that we have no very definite information available in this office. My dear Miss Eggleston:

This is in confirmation of our telephone conversation this morning. I have today received a letter from Mr. P. C. Hou in which he raises the question as to his plans for this summer. Our recent cable from Shantung Christian University made it clear that they expect him to return there in time for the fall session beginning on September 15, 1927. This would necessitate his leaving the United States about the middle of August. Dr. Hou suggests that it should still be possible for him to continue his plan to study with Dr. Mallory in Boston during the summer. He states that his present fellowship will not be completed until October of this year. Apparently the only detail which would interfere with the summer study with Dr. Mallory is the question of travel expenses from Chicago to Boston and such laboratory fees as might be.

I believe Dr. Hou has already written you making application for assistance from the Rockefeller Foundation in meeting this additional travel and study expense.

Our New York office has no authority to make any commitment for Shantung Christian University without authorization from the field. It would not be possible to handle the matter by correspondence in time for Dr. Hou to carry out his plans in Boston this summer. If the Rockefeller Foundation finds it possible to assist Dr. Hou in this matter we would appreciate it very much. Dr. Hou has done splendid work in Chicago during the past year and is apparently taking in an excellent spirit his recall to China without the anticipated study in Berlin. 

My dear Dr. Pearce,

In accordance with instructions from the Board of Governors of Shantung Christian University I am presenting to the Division of Medical Education of the Rockefeller Foundation our request for a one-year continuance of the Foundation's present grant of M. \$49,000 annually toward the support of the work of the School of Medicine.

The present agreement between the University and the Foundation terminates, as you know, in the summer of 1928. You are familiar with the fact that during the last year the University has been seeking every possible opportunity to secure an endowment sufficient to replace this annual grant which the Foundation has so generously provided. Yet the conditions throughout China have been such as to make any effective financial promotion in the West almost impossible. It is now apparent that it will not be possible to secure an adequate endowment for another year or two at least. In the meantime, if the School of Medicine of Shantung Christian University is to continue the splendid work which it has built up with the support of the Foundation, it is essential that adequate support be continued.

The mission boards and other agencies cooperating in Shantung Christian University are continuing their support on the same scale as before, and some are even adding to their former contributions. The work in China has passed through an exceedingly difficult year with a minimum of interruption. The year just ahead offers increased opportunities of service in the field of medical education.

May we express our most earnest hope that the Foundation will find it possible to continue for this additional year the support so essential to the continuance of the Shantung Christian University School of Medicine?

I have the honor to inform you that at a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Rockefeller Foundation held November 4, 1927, the following action was taken:
