Dear Dr. Kiang:

Confirming our conversation of yesterday's date concerning the use of the grant of M\$49,000 which was made by the Rockefeller Foundation to the School of Medicine of the Shantung Christian University on the 4th of November 1927. I have the following to say.

1. That the conditions actually laid down in the grant are as follows: "that the sum of Twenty-eight thousand dollars Chinese silver currency (M 28,000) is provided by the Women's Committee of the said university, or from other sources, over and above the amounts provided in the budget of the School of Medicine prior to the year 1923-1924, and with the further understanding that if the full amount is not contributed by the Women's Committee or from other sources the contribution of the Foundation shall be proportionately reduced."
2. That the M 16,000 which has been added to the previous annual grants of M 33,000 was clearly for extension of the work looking to the building of the new hospital.
3. That I do not think it would be at all a proper use of these funds to relieve any of the other contributing organizations of their share of the operating expenses of the School of Medicine. Such a use of the funds would be a violation of the spirit of our agreement and would, I fear, have an unfavorable effect upon any future requests for aid.
4. Any dropping below the standards indicated in No. 1 above would, of course, automatically decrease proportionately the amount available from the Foundation.

I would be glad to have a statement of the present status of the hospital building. How far has that gone and what are your plans in connection with it?

Dear Dr. Kiang:

Confirming our conversation of yesterday's date concerning the use of the grant of M\$49,000 which was made by the Rockefeller Foundation to the School of Medicine of the Shantung Christian University on the 4th of November 1927. I have the following to say.

1. That the conditions actually laid down in the grant are as follows: "That the sum of Twenty-eight thousand dollars Chinese silver currency (M\$28,000) is provided by the Women's Committee of the said university, or from other sources, over and above the amounts provided in the budget of the School of Medicine prior to the year 1923-1924, and with the further understanding that if the full amount is not contributed by the Women's Committee or from other sources the contribution of the Foundation shall be proportionately reduced."
2. That the M\$16,000 which has been added to the previous annual grants of M\$33,000 was clearly for extension of the work looking to the building of the new hospital.
3. That I do not think it would be at all a proper use of these funds to relieve any of the other contributing organizations of their share of the operating expenses of the School of Medicine. Such a use of the funds would be a violation of the spirit of our agreement and would, I fear, have an unfavorable effect upon any future requests for aid.
4. Any dropping below the standards indicated in No. 1 above would, of course, automatically decrease proportionately the amount available from the foundation.

I would be glad to have a statement of the present status of the hospital building, how far has that gone and what are your plans in connection with it?

My dear Dr. Carter:

Let me acknowledge receipt of your letter of December 23 relative to the payment of the balance of Mex.\$5,850 to Shantung Christian University on Appropriation CM 2729 for the year 1929-30.

I am enclosing herewith a statement of expenditures and receipts in the Pre-medical Department during the fiscal year 1929-30. Although the University passed through an extremely difficult period during the past fiscal year, and this difficulty is reflected to a degree in the attached financial statement, there is cause for real gratification over the fact that the University passed through such a trying time without any more serious interruption of its work and without any more serious financial losses. News coming from the field during recent months shows that the University opened up in September, 1930, with all departments functioning, with a large number of well qualified additional staff members, and with a surprisingly satisfactory enrolment.

On the attached statement I have not attempted to make an absolutely correct division between student fees and Mission Board appropriations of the total of L.C. \$16,219.04 received from these two sources. The report of the Field Treasurer from which this statement was drawn does not separate into the various of the Arts College the total student fees received last year. I believe, however, that the division we have indicated is reasonably accurate.

We sincerely hope that on the basis of this report it will be possible for the Foundation to make payment of the balance of Mex.\$5,850 due on Appropriation CM 2729. If you find such payment to be in order we would request that it be made in the form of a draft on Shanghai.

My dear Dr. Carter:

Some weeks ago the North American Section of the Shantung Board of Governors, after studying the serious financial situation which the University is this year facing because of the radical decrease in the value of silver, voted to present an emergency request to the supporting Boards and organizations that where their appropriations are defined in terms of local currency such appropriations be restated for the current year in terms of gold at two to one, or that some other adjustment be made which would give the University an amount more nearly equal to the normal gold equivalent of these appropriations.

In taking this action the Section recognized that any appeal to supporting organizations for modifications of appropriations for a fiscal year already begun should never be taken except for the most urgent reasons, but it believed that the unusual conditions now prevailing are sufficient justification for such a request at this time.

I have delayed communicating this request to the Rockefeller Foundation until I could give you some assurance that the Mission Boards cooperating in the University are responding favorably to this appeal for assistance. It is now possible to give you this assurance. The Northern Presbyterian Board, which makes the largest contribution toward the Medical work in Cheeloo, has increased by 50% its Mexican appropriation for 1950-51. The United Church of Canada, which ranks second among our American Boards in its support of the medical work, has restated its appropriation on the gold basis. The Woman's Foreign Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church is increasing its contribution by one-sixth. The Woman's Missionary Society of the United Church of Canada is just beginning its first cash grant toward the budget of the University, with an expressed desire that at least the major part of such grant be used for work in medicine. I understand that both the other two North American boards cooperating in the work at Cheeloo are giving sympathetic consideration to the request and that favorable actions are likely to result. In Great Britain most of the cooperating boards are likewise making favorable adjustments of their appropriations.

You are already so intimately acquainted both with the situation in China as a whole and with the conditions existing at Cheeloo in particular that I need not go into any detailed description of the factors which make this restatement of existing appropriations so necessary. While the operating expenses of our Christian higher educational institutions are not rising so rapidly as the local currency dollar has shrunk in value, their expenses of all kinds have risen very substantially. Cheeloo has found its position particularly difficult because of two special elements in its situation. In the first place the proportion of its income being received in gold is unusually small, and that of the appropriations being paid in local currency is unusually large, thus giving a minimum advantage from the favorable exchange rate of gold. In the second place, the quantity of medical and scientific equipment and supplies which must be purchased on a gold basis is quite large, and the loss thus incurred on exchange rates is very heavy.

We earnestly hope that in view of these conditions the Rockefeller Foundation may find it possible so to revise its appropriation of Mex. \$40,000, made on November 8, 1929, toward the support of the medical work at Cheeloo during 1930-31, as will compensate in a measure for the reduced value of this amount in local currency. If a revision for 1930-31 could be made along the lines already approved for 1931-32, where your appropriation is defined as Mex. \$20,000 plus gold \$10,000, great relief would be afforded to the University. At the same time the Foundation would still not be required to disburse more than approximately three-fourths of the gold amount reserved to meet this 1930-31 appropriation.

We will greatly appreciate your kindness in bringing this request to the attention of the Foundation.





RESOLVED that the sum of Twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary, be, and it is hereby, appropriated, to purchase Twenty thousand dollars Chinese silver currency (Mex. 20,000) and also to provide Ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) gold for maintenance of the SCHOOL OF MEDICINE of the SHANTUNG CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY during the year 1930-1931, on condition that the sum of Twenty-eight thousand dollars Chinese silver currency (Mex. 28,000) be provided by the Women's Committee of the said University, or from other sources, over and above the amounts provided in the budget of the School of Medicine prior to the year 1923-1924, and with the further understanding that if the full amount is not contributed by the Women's Committee or from other sources, the contribution of the Foundation shall be proportionately reduced.

For several years there have been intermittent exchanges of correspondence between our office and the Rockefeller Foundation with regard to the question whether any amount might be due to Shantung Christian University in accordance with your China Medical Board appropriation C.M. 2028, which set aside the sum of \$ 200,000 to meet possible losses in exchange on remittances of capital expenditures made by the China Medical Board or by the supporting societies for the School of Medicine of Shantung Christian University. No final settlement of the matter resulted from this correspondence, because of our inability to secure from the field any exact statement as to the amount of losses in exchange that the University might properly claim under the terms of this appropriation.

*August 20, 1931*  
I have now received a letter from Dr. Randolph T. Shields, Dean of the School of Medicine, written after ~~the~~ consultation with the Field Treasurer of the University. The attitude on the field is, that since the amount the University could rightly claim under this appropriation is quite small, and inasmuch as the Rockefeller Foundation has dealt very generously with the University, particularly in making their appropriations for the last two years on a basis which allows the University to benefit by the favorable rate of exchange now prevailing, the University is inclined to waive any claim for loss in exchange under appropriation C.M. 2028.

We therefore suggest, that the Foundation make record of the fact the University has no claim to present for loss in exchange under the terms of appropriation C.M. 2028. I presume that this would permit you to cancel this appropriation, and thus to clear the matter finally on your records. If this procedure in any way is unsatisfactory to the Foundation, please let me know, and I will be happy to pursue the matter further along any line you may suggest.

Let me acknowledge your letter of November 4th in which you are discussing the disposition of appropriation C. M. 2695 for loss in exchange in transmitting funds for the building program of Shantung Christian University.

In the last paragraph of your letter you refer to the figure of Mex. \$7,855.81 reported in our earlier correspondence as the loss in exchange on some of the earlier remittances sent to the field for the building program, and inquire whether we had this amount in mind when we wrote our letter of October 21st.

The understanding I have gained from the letter received from Dr. Shields, is that the University does not wish to ask for any payment whatever under this appropriation on account of the loss in exchange. While it is true that Mex. \$7,855.81 was lost on early remittances, I believe there were other funds transferred to the field later for deposit in a sound international banking institution until the building program could be undertaken, and that the gain on these later remittances compensated for earlier losses. At present rates of exchange the funds still held in gold would receive a substantial gain when converted into Mex. What we intended to recommend, therefore, was that, in view of all these facts and because of the generous treatment the Foundation has always accorded Shantung Christian University, appropriation C.M. 2695 be cancelled and closed out on your books without any payment whatever for loss in exchange.

My dear Mr. Garside:

I have consulted our Comptroller about appropriation C.M. 2693, \$30,000 for loss in exchange toward the building program of Shantung Christian University, which you suggest in your letter of October 21 may be allowed to lapse. As the building program could not be carried out according to the plans made at the time of this appropriation, November 5, 1924, and as the exchange situation has changed radically, the appropriation does not fit present conditions, and we should be very glad to close it out on our books.

This appropriation was made to make up a deficit anticipated on the whole building program because of unfavorable exchange. If the program had been carried out as planned, therefore, gains in exchange would have been applied against losses to compute the net loss. 



In addition to the A.P.M. N. grant of \$2,000, they have, this Mr. N. Gist Gee, Esq., \$12,000 to the General University, which relieves Rockefeller Foundation, its usual grant of, approximately, \$5,000 to the PEIPING University.

Dear Mr. Gee, it is almost impossible to estimate just now what missionary salaries are, as the various missions pay in different ways. Last year, I should have written to you sooner in regard to the request for the renewal of the grant from the Rockefeller Foundation for the year 1932-33. I have finally, with Mr. Lair's assistance, made out a financial statement, as enclosed, which I think will be clear to you. These figures have been used by the Board Secretaries in estimating the costs of missionaries. The Hospital, as you know, receives a grant every year from the School of Medicine. It varies, of course, but is in the neighbourhood of \$30,000.00, and is given to make up the deficit in the hospital budget, as the grants from the missions are all made as to the School of Medicine. Our hospital had space by building the new hospital. We must have more beds for You will see that, during the last year, owing to the increased grants from missions and the Rockefeller Foundation over the budgeted receipts, we had an actual surplus of \$22,439.60. On the other hand, our total expenditures were \$166,816.17. The expenditures, as estimated in the budget, were only \$138,969.00. Therefore, if we had received no increased receipts over the budget during the year 1930-31, we should have had a deficit of \$27,847.17. Adding the actual surplus and the expected deficit, gives us a total surplus over the budget of \$50,286.77. Without the help, however, of the Rockefeller Foundation, we should have to The next item shows the sources of the receipts over the budget, and the third item, on page 2, shows how the actual surplus of \$22,439.60 was allocated. We began the year 1930-31 with a deficit of \$10,470.75, due to losses from exchange during the year 1929-30. We also owed the Women's Unit Building Fund \$3,124.94. to progress and render efficient service to this country.

In making up our budget for 1931-32, we estimated that we should need \$179,340.00, but, as we were afraid to reckon on the exchange at more than \$3 to \$1, or \$15 to the £, the budget was cut down to \$265,340.00. You can readily understand that making budgets is more or less of a gamble, with exchange as it is. As an example: we receive £680 from three of our supporting British Societies. The difference in the rate of the pound sterling between the present and what it was ten days ago would make a difference of at least \$4,000 to our budget. We have not only to watch our expenditures, but we have to watch the exchange, and be prepared to spend the full amount allowed or to restrict accordingly.

I am adding a summary of the budget of the present year 1931-32, including a list of the receipts. I think we can reasonably expect that the budget which we shall make for 1932-33 will be similar to this. You will note that many of the grants are now made in gold, and those that are not definitely made in gold are mostly contingent on the current rate of exchange. As I said before, we have estimated this budget on a basis of G.\$1 to Mex.\$3 or £1 to Mex. \$15. The pound sterling has dropped recently almost to this mark. If exchange should continue to be favourable,

Acting under the authority granted by the Executive Committee on March 17, 1933, to approve emergency aid for equipment and current maintenance in science teaching in Chinese institutions, the officers on March 29, 1933, have approved the following grants:

Nanking .....	\$4,250	Towards the College of Science for equipment (\$2,500), current year maintenance (\$1,000), and salary for professorship in physics (\$750)
Soochow .....	\$4,000	Towards the general maintenance of the science department for the current year
Lingnan .....	\$10,000	for assistance to the Department of Science, with the understanding that not more than \$5,000 be used for apparatus and that the remainder be used for salaries for the year 1933-1934
Cheeleo .....	\$2,500	towards the general maintenance of work in the natural sciences for the current year
Sinling .....	\$1,250	towards the general maintenance of the science department for the current year

You will notice that in the case of Lingnan the grant is for \$10,000 rather than for the total of your recommendation. The Executive Committee in authorizing the officers had already placed a limit of \$10,000 for any one officers' action.

We shall be prepared to make payments under these actions as requested, either to the institutions in China or to their representatives in this country. Will you please instruct us upon this point?

We assume that you will wish to notify the institutions to which grants have been made, and are sending a copy of this letter to Mr. E. A. Garside of the Associated Boards for Christian Colleges in China in New York City.

It has been several weeks since I have received the copy of your letter of April 6th addressed to Mr. Gunn, listing the emergency appropriations made to five of our China colleges for the coming year.

During intervening weeks, the Boards of Trustees of most of these five institutions have held meetings, and we have reported to them the good news of this additional aid from the Rockefeller Foundation. In each case the Trustees have asked me to communicate to the Rockefeller Foundation assurances of their sincere appreciation of this urgently needed aid. All of our colleges have been struggling with unusually severe financial difficulties this year, and the prospects for next year are not much brighter.

We note that the following appropriations are designated as having been made "for the current year":-

Nanking	\$4,250.00
Cheeloo	2,500.00
Giating	1,250.00

I presume that these amounts are intended for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1933. As yet we have not had time to receive any instructions from the field as to when and how they wish these amounts drawn, but no doubt we will be receiving their requests within the next few weeks.

Mr. Olin D. Wannamaker is already in touch with you in regard to the payment of the appropriation of \$10,000 to Lingnan University.

Our office does not handle the accounts of Soochow University, but we are communicating the information in your letter of April 6th to Dr. W. G. 





Dear Doctor Shields:

In connection with your request of September 25 for a renewal of the annual grant, we reviewed with care the relationships between the Foundation and the Shantung Christian University since the grant of March 7, 1916. 

On February 28th we had a meeting of the North American Section of our Shantung Board of Governors at which was presented the action of the Trustees of the Rockefeller Foundation on December 15th, 1933 continuing your appropriation for medical work at Shantung Christian University for the year 1934-35 on a reduced basis with the understanding that this appropriation terminated any obligation on the part of the Rockefeller Foundation to the support of medical work at Shantung.

After full discussion our Shantung Governors took the following actions:-

"VOTED, that, having been notified of the action of the Rockefeller Foundation on December 15th, 1933 with reference to its appropriation to the Cheeloo School of Medicine for 1934-35, the North American Section of the Board of Governors of Shantung Christian University

(1) Express to the Rockefeller Foundation the profound appreciation of all those related to the University for the friendly and generous support of the Cheeloo medical work which the Foundation has given during the past eighteen years, without which the School of Medicine as it now exists could not have been built up or maintained;

(2) Assure the Foundation that efforts are already under way, both in China and in the West, to develop more permanent support of the Cheeloo School of Medicine. It is our earnest hope that at a later date the Foundation will be willing to consider the University's request for assistance in the urgent next step of building up more adequate and more permanent support for the vital part of the program of medical education in China."
