Dear Dr. Cartwright:

I am glad to be able to report to you that a very fruitful Annual Meeting of the Board of Governors was held in New York on Wednesday, May 15th. We had the great advantage of having with us the Chancellor of the University, Dr. Joseph Beech, who had just returned from China and was in a position to give us the latest details concerning the progress of the University.

The minutes of the proceedings are enclosed herewith, and it is hoped that you may find time to give them a careful perusal, conveying to the members of your Board the main points in their contents. There are just two items referred to therein, Nos. G-1463 and G-1465, to which the Board asked me to direct the special attention of Board Secretaries and the Mission Boards which they represent. These deal with the Union Middle School and the Union Theological College. The Board of Governors received full reports of the work of both these institutions; that of the latter has already been circulated to all members of the Board of Governors and, no doubt, you have already studied it. I am asked to say that the Board is entirely satisfied that both these institutions are doing vitally important work, which has a direct bearing upon the University and the ideals for which it stands. The Board trusts, therefore, that each Mission Board will give them the fullest support within its power.

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

Do you have any statement to make that we could publish, or any light to shed on this warning from Hochi?

Dear Mr. Baker,

I have your memorandum with regard to the article in PM.

We have had no direct news from China in recent weeks as to any actual or prospective moves on the part of the Japanese with regard to taking "drastic control of all foreign schools".

We presume that if any moves in this direction had been made we should have been notified by cable.

As you know, all except one of our Christian Colleges have already moved to temporary campuses outside of the area under control of the Japanese. Any more drastic acts by the Japanese would therefore not affect these colleges unless they are able to extend the area which they control.

The one new area over which they are likely to gain control to the detriment of our college work is the International Settlement in Shanghai, where four of our Colleges (St. John's, Hangchow, Shanghai, and Soochow University) have been carrying on their work jointly in temporary quarters. If the Japanese get control of the Settlement, these Colleges may either make an attempt to continue their work or else may move into the interior, where they will be out of Japanese reach. As far as we know, this decision has not yet been made by the four Colleges.

The one institution which has continued to operate in Japanese controlled territory is Yenching in Peking. Due to a variety of special factors the Japanese have not made any efforts to interfere in the work of Yenching, and we hope that these same conditions may continue to hold during the coming year. Yenching has indicated that if at any time it is not permitted to carry on unhampered work in Peking, the University will transfer its teaching work





I think that you are quite right in keeping this money in the States until we are really ready to use it. It is now in the hand of the WFMS there, I think, or in the hands of the governing Board of the Woman's College. We shall measure the land carefully here, and then Miss Streeter, the present dean of the Woman's College, and I will draw up a joint statement which we will forward to you and to their Board, thus giving you the necessary information which will make possible the drawing up of the necessary papers and exchange of money there. The total amount of land is something between fourteen and fifteen acres (Chinese), and will have to be measured carefully before we can give you the exact figure. I am informing the Theological College of this gift, and hope that within the next few years we can find the money needed to carry through our plans."

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

Pursuant to our conversation of even date, I am herewith giving you a memorandum covering the over-payment of merchandise purchased by Dr. Beech from Mrs. R. A. Peterson.

Dr. Beech took with him to the Orient an order of hospital merchandise. Dr. Cheer purchased \$1200.00 of this equipment, and it was replaced by Dr. Beech buying a like quantity from Mrs. R. A. Peterson who was holding a large shipment sent out by Dr. Peterson. During March last, in Chungking, Dr. Cheer promised Dr. Beech immediate payment to the University Treasurer for this amount. Accordingly we were instructed to make payment to the Methodist Board, but information at that time regarding the transaction was insufficient for us to take proper action. Later, upon the advice of Dr. Beech, the Methodist Board was paid \$1200.00 to be credited to the Peterson account. Meanwhile, on this account, the field issued Draft #984 for \$427.48 to the Methodist Board and same was paid July, 1940; and also a draft for \$318.34 which will be refused upon presentation, together with an order to pay \$433.30 to the Methodist Board which has been cancelled. The Treasurer of West China Union University should be reimbursed for \$427.48 by the Methodist Board.

My dear Mr. Evans:

Communications have been received from Burma calling attention to the large amount of shipping business which is going through Burma to West China over the Burma Road, and further calling attention to the fact that several missionaries of various denominations are giving a large block of time to the facilitating of this business. It has been proposed that the boards unite in establishing an Inter-Mission Business Office in Rangoon to relieve their missionaries and further facilitate the moving of mission goods to West China. With this in mind a tentative budget has been drawn up. In the nature of the case this budget is very tentative. The salary will depend upon the missionary who may be secured, his term of service, the size of his family, etc., but it is thought that this is a fairly good estimate of the amount that will be involved.

A Committee of Four, consisting of Forrest Smith, Treasurer of the American Baptist Foreign Missionary Society; C.A. Evans, Assistant Treasurer of the Associated Boards for Christian Colleges in China; James E. Whitney, Assistant Treasurer of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Protestant Episcopal Church; and George F. Sutherland, Associate Treasurer of the Division of Foreign Missions of the Board of Missions and Church Extension of The Methodist Church, was appointed to investigate and, if possible, inaugurate such an office. This Committee asked the undersigned to communicate with the various boards concerned, asking two questions:-

1. Do you know any missionary who would be free and who would be capable to render the service involved in the establishing of such an Inter-Mission Business Office in Rangoon?
2. Would you be interested in cooperating in this Inter-Mission Business Office on the basis of the approximate budget enclosed, it being understood that this budget will be divided among the cooperating boards either on the

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basis of the number of missionaries who are being served or on the basis of the amount of business which the Inter-Mission Business Office does for the various missions? It is not quite clear which would be the most equitable division but in view of the institutions involved it would seem that a division on the basis of service rendered would be more equitable than on the basis of the number of missionaries.

There has been some discussion as to the necessity of such an Office, if established, buying its own trucks but in view of the report of the American experts who went carefully into the whole question of transportation on the Burma Road it is thought that this matter ought not to be taken up until we have further information or until the Office is established.



This will belatedly acknowledge your letter of July 17th, which accompanied the closing papers for the West China Union University for the past fiscal year.


