My dear Dr. Phillips:

Yenching University in Peiping, China, was American-founded. It is largely American-supported. By many authorities it is regarded as the most important factor in the gradual but sure development of the great New China which is being wrought with such great difficulty out of the infinite disorder among its hordes of nearly half a billion people.

Yenching, already with close and direct affiliations with Harvard, Princeton, Wellesley and the University of Missouri, and with indirect ties with several other American centers of culture, is producing great Chinese leaders for New China. Though founded as a Christian institution, and though loyally supported by several denominational missionary boards, the activities and teaching of Yenching are enthusiastically approved by the non-Christian leaders in China. Through all the national disorders of recent years, Yenching under the wise direction of Dr. J. Leighton Stuart has gone along undisturbed. All the elements in confused China recognize that Yenching is laboring ceaselessly for the ultimate stabilization of all China.

Yenching has excellent physical facilities. Its name is the former name of the City of Peking, known today as Peiping. It is the union of a number of Christian colleges in the Peiping region, all of which have been brought together on a beautiful campus just outside the city. Its endowment and trust funds are nearly three millions, having this summer been increased by \$500,000 through the successful matching of a conditional gift of \$250,000 from the Rockefeller Foundation. The budget for 1932-33 is approximately \$255,000 computed on the present rate of exchange.

America's interest in China's rapidly increasing population — more than four hundred millions now, or practically four Chinese for each American — must be built up. Observers are agreed that, regardless of anything we do, China is becoming increasingly important to all Americans. In trade alone, a friendly and an organized China can bring us many additional millions of dollars annually.

To foster this increase in interest we are seeking to enlarge the membership on the American Advisory Council of Yenching University. Membership involves no dues. There is no obligation to give money. The objectives are to create wide-spread interest in the present needs and the great future possibilities of China; to develop an understanding of the inseparable futures of America and China. Members of the Advisory Council are asked to take a real interest in the development of a stable China and to help cultivate friendship with the Chinese people.
