Camps, we were both offered positions
teaching in the center at Tule Lake, California.
We were there from the opening to the close of
the schools, i.e., three years and four months.
Tule Lake was known as the hot spot of the
Japanese centers, and made the headlines. We
were both held prisoners by the Japanese mob,
who surrounded our buildings. This lasted four hours.
After that we were not allowed in the "colony" for months.
Likewise the schools were closed several months,
for it was not considered safe for teachers to
go into the area where the Japanese lived. The
story is too long to tell.

We think our experience at Tule Lake was
more profitable for us and those we served
than was life in prison camps in China
during the war.

I lived in Yenching University Peiping in Japanese occupied North China
from 1937 till Dec 8th 1941 with the exception of one year furlough which
took me to England for the outbreak of the war in Europe and the summer
of 1940. From Dec 8th 1941 till the end of the Pacific war I was living
under Japanese control first lightly interned in Peiping later in strict
internment at Wei Hsien Shan Tung.

INTERNEED, CAPTURED, BOMBED, ETC? _____

In the interment camp at Wei Hsien Shan Tung I had the privilege of taking
part in an extremely interesting experience as though two and a half years
of poverty seclusion and severely simple living we endeavoured to build
a Christian community in our little township of 1500 assorted nationalities.
The camp was at first the home of all "allied" missionaries, Catholic and
Protestant of North China so that we began with a population more than half
missionary by profession. After the first few months most of the Catholic
priests and sisters and almost all the Americans were repatriated or returned
to Peiping but the addition of a group of C.I.M. Missionaries and the
Chefoo internees brought the active Christian population to about one sixth
of the total number of internees in the camp and added strong Fundamentalists
to our ~~Protestant~~ group which already included representatives of practically
every branch of the Christian Church as well as Moslems Parsees and very
many frankly irreligious. Our life together during the next two years
brought a vision of the Church Universal both in theory and practice, a
discipline of personal and of corporate prayer, and a practice of Christian
evangelism - experiences which those of us who shared in them will never
forget and which have left far too deep an impression on our lives to be
described in a few lines.

37. PLEASE TELL BRIEFLY ABOUT ANY UNUSUAL EXPERIENCES YOU HAVE HAD. FOR EXAMPLE, WERE YOU INTERNED, CAPTURED, BOMBED, ETC? To be requested by the War Area Service Corps to take care of billet and mess for all military personnel of all allied forces in the provinces of Szechuen, Shensi and Hupei was rather an unusual experience that I have had. At the time when the entire Chinese coast was under Japanese naval blockade, Loyang in enemy hand and Japanese columns advancing towards Kwei-yang, we accepted the task of procuring each month 225,000 pounds of sugar, 1,800,000 pieces of eggs and 675,000 pounds of meat among numerous items of daily necessity. Not only that we took it as our duty to provide six ounces of sugar, four pieces of eggs and eighteen ounces of meat for each American soldier every day but we were also requested to hunt for fresh eggs to feed the wounded ^{from Burma. While procuring food for the} American troops, we felt that it was our moral duty to carefully plan out purchasing methods to prevent the general public from suffering the effect of rising prices due to the increase demand and only a limit source of supply. We would not have completely succeeded in carrying out our mission without the cooperation of General Chang Chun governor and concurrently director of the generalissimo's headquarters for ^{Szechuen} the Northwest (at present Premier for China), ^{headquarters} General Li Chung-jen, director of the generalissimo's office in Peiping, General Chu Shou-chou governor of Shensi, the U. S. Army personnel in China, the Kiang Tribe of the Asiatic Plateau, the various native guilds and a host of others.

I was tried 4 times for collaboration with Americans and for dangerous thinking. I was ill for a period in the prison, though not seriously. I had no spectacles, no belt, no book to read, no message from outside, sitting the live long day. Therefore I prayed, made intercessory prayers for all whom I could think of, and about, criticized my past conduct, and composed 131 poems in thought (which I wrote down after my release). My mental and spiritual exercises kept me in shape and my faith deepened. I had 5 dreams, ^{in which God appeared in the form of my earthly father,} each of which gave me strangely specific guidance and comfort. I prayed for and preached to Prof. Chang who was not a Christian, comforting & serving ^{him} during the time when he wanted to commit suicide and when he was dangerously ill. I was court-martialed with 5 others & was released from prison on probation after having been sentenced to one year's imprisonment. During my days after leaving prison, I taught the Christian ministers of the Anglican church and wrote "An Interpretation of Christianity," "The Life and Letters of St. Paul," and several smaller books.

DR. T. C. CHAO

Dean, Yenching University School of Religion

Tsu-ch'ien Chao was born February 14, 1888 in Hsu-Tsun, Chekiang, China. After graduating in 1910 from Soochow University in Soochow, one of the twelve Christian Colleges in China, Dr. Chao came to the United States for advanced study and received the master of arts degree from Vanderbilt University in 1916 and a bachelor of divinity degree from the same university the following year. He has also studied at Balliol College, Oxford, and his honorary degrees include a D. Litt. from Soochow in 1927 and D. D. from Princeton in 1947.

Prior to his becoming professor of religion at Yenching University in Peiping in 1925, he had taught English, sociology, and religion at Soochow University for seven years. He became dean of Soochow's College of Arts and Sciences and professor of philosophy in 1923.

Dr. Chao was a delegate to the International Missionary Council meeting at Jerusalem in 1928, and at Madras in 1938. He has been a member of the National Christian Council of China, the National Committee of the Young Men's Christian Association of China, and of many other religious and national associations. His influence is nationwide not only in the Christian movement but also in Chinese letters. He was interned for six months by the Japanese after Pearl Harbor and upon release took up active Christian work in connection with the Anglican Church in North China. When Yenching again opened in Peiping in December, 1945, he returned as dean of the School of Religion.

He visited the United States in April, 1947, under the auspices of the World Council of Churches and The International Missionary Council, and was a member of the Provisional Committee of the World Council of Churches which met that year at Buck Hill Falls, Pa. In 1948 he was elected one of the six presidents at the World Council of Churches Assembly at Amsterdam.

Among his numerous publications in English and Chinese are: A CHRISTIAN PHILOSOPHY, 1926; A LIFE OF JESUS, 1934; and several volumes of poems and hymns.

During the eight years of war with Japan, I was a journalist in the first five years and taught in Yenching in the later three years. 1937-38, editor, Shanghai Ta Kung Pao; 1939-40, editor, Hongkong Ta Kung Pao; 1941-42, Editor-in-chief, Kweilin Ta Kung Pao; 1942-45, teaching in Yenching in Chengtu, Szechuan.

37. PLEASE TELL BRIEFLY ABOUT ANY UNUSUAL EXPERIENCES YOU HAVE HAD. FOR EXAMPLE, WERE YOU INTERNED, CAPTURED, BOMBED, ETC?

When I was a reporter covering Shanghai war in the fall of 1937, I went to the front every day and night. One dark night my car took a wrong direction so that I was brought to a place only 50 meters to the front of Japanese line. I was shot by the Japanese, but it is so lucky that I escaped safely.

I was bombed by the Japanese many many times. When we left Hongkong for Kweilin, capitol of Kwangsi province, we were bombed every day during the journey. One morning, my wife was aboard on a small boat on the East River of Kwangtung province and six Japanese bombers hit the boat. Three other boats near us were sunk by bombs but my wife's boat was luckily escaped.

When I was in Kweilin our buildings (Ta Kung Pao) were the targets of Japanese bombers. I was a night worker but could not sleep in the morning. Jap bombers visited us every morning and forced me to change my daily schedule. During that period I always slept five or six hours a day.

At Kunming, I was teaching at the National Tung-ohi University and was also a British Indemnity Fellow at the Research Institute of Physics, National Academy of Peiping (moved to Kunming). In the fall of 1939, I came to join the faculty of Yenching University and remained till the University was forced to close down on December 8, 1941. During 1942 to 1945, I was teaching at the Catholic University of Peiping. When Yenching reopened at its original campus, I returned to this University.

When the city of Canton was under the frequent air raid, day and night, during the period 1937 to 1938, I shared with other faculty members and the students of Lingnan University the experience of carrying on teaching and study under mental tension, and sometimes even physical fatigue when one could not have a good sleep in the night. I was several times in the downtown district when the city was being bombarded.

Travelling in the interior provinces among the congested refugees rushing in from the coastal regions and the lower Yangtze valley was another unusual experience to me.

When the Yenching campus was occupied by Japanese military force in December 1941, many colleagues were arrested, while others were questioned and their residences searched. All the faculty members living on the campus with their families were not allowed to move out till three months later. During this period, especially the first few weeks, one did not know what would happen the next hour.

During the year from the summer of 1937 to the next summer, I shared with others at Lingnan University, Canton, the experience of carrying on teaching and study under frequent air raids. Then, in October 1938, Japanese landed in South China, we had to leave the city in a hurry. It was extremely difficult to travel in the interior provinces among the congested refugees rushing in at that time from the lower Yangtse Valley and the coastal regions.

I was at Yenching when, on December 8, 1941, the University was occupied and forced to close down by the Japanese military force. Many Chinese faculty members and students were arrested, while others were questioned and their residences searched. I was among those who lived on the campus with their families and were not allowed to move out till three months later; during this period, especially in the first few weeks, one did not know what would happen the next hour.

36. WHERE WERE YOU AND WHAT DID YOU DO DURING THE WAR? From 1938-42 while serving concurrently for Kansu Science Education Institute, Labrang People's Education Institute, & for the Provincial Commission of Education of Kansu, I was conducting social educational programs for the promotion of Science education, throughout the whole province, Kansu. From 1942-46, I was in Chengtu, working for the Churches in Chengtu, Szechuan, & for the West China Union Theological College as its associate professor and Dean of Studies. 37. PLEASE TELL BRIEFLY ABOUT ANY UNUSUAL EXPERIENCES YOU HAVE HAD. FOR EXAMPLE, WERE YOU INTERNED, CAPTURED, BOMBED, ETC? _____

I was ^{not} interned, nor captured, nor hurt, though bombed, during the war. My interesting & unusual experiences during the war were with the "border" people, including school teachers, school boys & girls, Mohammedans, Tibetans, Lamas, "Living Buddha", Tibetan princes, generals, officials, etc. My experience in Kansu in general, in Labrang, in the North West of Kansu, on the mountains, on the Gobi hills - caves, etc, in particular, were both fascinating & instructive. It would take a whole chapter if not a whole book to describe them. A short sketch of these experiences can be seen in my "Reminiscences", pending a fuller account of them in the future.

Appendix C.
Reminiscences
of a University Chaplain and Teacher of Church History

David K. Y. Fang

① It would take a book to tell the essential facts concerning my decision for Christian work as a minister and as a teacher of Church History. I mean to say that for a young Chinese today to become a Christian is a difficult thing, and for him to decide for the ministry is by no means easy. It involves a resolution of the mind and heart. It may mean spiritual tempest and storm. It may result in social isolation or persecution. For my part, I have met with discouragement more than once which has been overcome only with pain. And so the whole matter is a matter of spiritual struggle and conviction, a matter of Divine love and guidance, only to be understood by spiritual truth, spiritual value and spiritual insight. For this reason, under the encouragement of Dr. Y. P. Mei, I undertake to write these "Reminiscences", with the hope that they will reveal the love of God to you who are spiritually minded, and show how God has guided one of His children in his destiny.

② I can not begin my story without saying something in memory of my father and my mother. They both died when I was very young - my father, when I was only nine; my mother, when I was twelve. This fact I consider the biggest blow in my life, and the experience of it was most shocking and dreadful. Their love for me was so great, and the way they were taken away from me was so sudden, that the memory of it even now is unbearable.

③ My father was a Chinese scholar, an artist and a musician, with some knowledge of western medicine. He was considered a modernist among the local gentry and literati. He showed his modernism by taking the name of "Wei-hsin" (維新 "Modernization"), by sending my elder brother to a mission school of medicine, by connecting himself with the local church, by his association with the leading and progressive elements and activities of the city. I was the first among the boys in my native city, Yun Siao, not to have worn the queue, and my elder brother himself took part in the local revolutionary corps against the Manchu Dynasty. I myself was taught to read and write when I was only four, and was sent to the Kindergarten at six, where I first tasted the sweetness of Christian love. Being the youngest son I was taken into father's and mother's special care. I can still remember how my father would have me walk with him, with his hand on my shoulder, along the street, to learn Chinese characters from the sign-boards; how he would take me to his musical and social parties; and how my mother would have me kneel with her by the bed-side in earnest prayer every night - for although she was an uneducated peasant woman, she was an earnest Christian. It was my father and my mother who first kindled in me a love of God, of truth, and of humanity, and I thank God for it.

④ At the age of 16, I asked to be sent to a mission school, Westminster College in Ch'uan-chow, at a distance of five days' journey at that time. This was where I got most of the Christian training that was to remain with me through life. Of the teachers who influenced me most I shall speak only of two. The one was the tall Mr. Alan S. M. Anderson, and the other was the handsome Mr. Kingsley L. Underhill (both Englishmen). They were so kind hearted that they were regarded respectively as God-father and God-brother by the students. It was they who helped me to decide for Christ; it was they also who made the continuation of my education possible.

⑤ In 1922, when I was 18, a war broke out between Ch'en Chiung-ming, the rebel, and Sun Yat-sen. My native city was captured and sacked by the rebel. The looting

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lasted for several weeks, and the soldiers set fire to the city. My family barely escaped with their lives. As a result, my brother could not afford to send me to the school any longer. I wrote to my teachers, informing them of the misfortune, telling them that I was to stop my education and could no longer see them. Mr. Underhill wrote me in reply, urging me to go back to the school, pointing out that my schooling could be managed by either a special gift of the school or himself, or by a personal loan from him. I chose to accept a loan, and did go back to school. I just cannot tell how much I owe to his kindness which I can never repay. His personality and loving conduct inspired me. It was he also who imparted some ideas of the modern interpretation of Christianity and of what a Christ-like life should be, combining theology with personal life and social ethics, as we learn it from Christ in history.

6 Being so interested in the Christian way of life, I was soon made a leader of the Bible class in the school, and became an active worker in the school Y.M.C.A. This I consider the happiest period of my life, and I went into the work most joyously. We had a silent period every morning in our school for all the students, in which we could have our Bible-reading and meditation. I took to the Buddhistic method, having my prayer and Bible-reading in the cross-legged position. I kept a note book for self-examination, based on Franklin's "Thirteen Rules of Conduct", and a diary in which I wrote the plan for the day and daily reflections. This habit I kept for about two years until I came into contact with the revolutionary and romantic movements.

7 After my graduation from the middle school, I was employed as a teacher by a primary-junior middle school at yung Ch'un, thirty miles west of Ch'uan-chou. I taught thirty-two hours a week in that school besides morning chapels, singing classes and morning exercise, spending the rest of my time in reading the most radical literature of the day, often till very late at night. From an enthusiastic Christian I now inclined to become a revolutionary and a radical, and reacted somewhat against the "complacency" of Christianity. For this was in 1925 to 1926 when the revolutionary influence was most acute, and the political and social situation was becoming so bad that one could not remain peaceful if one did not try to do something for his country. The only way I could think of at that time was to take part in the social and political revolution. Theoretically, it was quite right as far as I can see now. But the trouble lies in the fact that social passion, with a mixture of untempered emotion and personal ambition, unguided by an adequate idea of what a genuine revolution should be, often leads to social and spiritual destruction and catastrophe. Experience has taught me to look for a better course. This is what I am going to tell you by and by.

8 Having taught for two years in the primary-junior middle school, I struggled to go to Fukien Christian University in Focchow for a university education. When my brother refused to support me, I ventured to put forth the idea that my share in the family estate could be spent for that purpose. My brother got so angry about it that he threatened to kill me. I revolted against my brother then for that reason, wishing to have nothing to do with him. Entrance to the university was made possible by the help of Mr. Anderson and Mr. Hsu Hsi-an, the principal of Westminster College. To them I was extremely grateful. It was in 1926 when I entered the university, and in the next year, the so called "Second Revolution" broke out. I was still an active Christian, only somewhat radically inclined. I was good at speaking. I stood high in school subjects. I led Bible classes. I came into contact with the "revolutionaries" or "leftists", and I cultivated the idea that Christians should and could be revolutionaries or vice versa. I protested that earnest Christians should not content themselves with empty prayers, Bible study or Sunday services. I urged that active Christians should take part in social and political movements. And I myself began to feel self-important, to become critical and arrogant, to neglect my prayer, to dislike my religious duty and discipline, to look down upon my fellow

Christians, to take my personal desire and ambition for social passion unvonsciously. Under the shield of enthusiasm and childish innocence, there lay hidden a seed of vanity and disobedience, a lust for vain-glory and self expansion. It was "I" who was to do all these great things. What had God to do with humanity. I even went so far as throw doubt on the existence of God, or to question as to what the idea of the existence of God should mean. I did not speak of it of course, and people thought that I was a "progressive Christian" but in fact I began to react against Christianity at this time.

9 Taking advantage of this childish innocence and emotional enthusiasm, which was really the work of Satan, the "revolutionaries" persuaded me to take part in their "Fight for Educational Independence" and "Anti Cultural Aggression" movements. I was then only a freshman. The experience during this period broke my heart, and I can not recall it without a pang of agony, for as I discovered afterwards the whole thing was treachery, the motive back of it was awful, and the methods used were most barbarous and wicked. I withdrew from the conspiracy at once and resolved to leave the university immediately. Just at this juncture, my mother school wrote to call me back. I dropped a note to the President, Dr. Gowdy, and to Mr. Scott, the Dean, telling them that "my head is under the mouth of a tiger", and that must leave the school at once to save myself from danger. After I got to my mother school, I received a letter from Mr. Scott, urging me to go back to the university when conditions improved. I wrote back, saying that I was (broken so heartedly, that I had no faith in the future, but wished to go into business instead of studying philosophical subjects (for I was one of Mr. Scott's favorites in philosophy). He wrote back again, showing his surprise and regret at the sudden change. Thanks be to God that I did not go into business after all, for I know I am not really "commercially" minded.

10 My principal made me a teacher of English in my mother school, Westminster College. But the inner urge for further education was so great, that I soon became restless. I finally decided to go to a university again, this time Yenching University. In the summer I went back home, and informed my brother of my resolution. Finding me obstinate in my purpose, he gave me fifty dollars, with another sum of sixty dollars from a relative. I started with that amoney to Ch'uan-chou again to consult with the principal. He promised to give an annual support of \$100, the first installment of which was to be sent when I got to the university. By that time I had some fifty dollars left. But with the assurance of the Principal, I started right away for Peking vis Shanghai all by myself, venturing on a journey outside my province for the first time.

11 The experience in Yenching was most thrilling and instructive. The incidents were so full of meaning and spiritual value that I feel must write a fuller account of them in the future if time permits. For the present, I can only give you a summary. (1) It was in Yenching where I had the hardest time in my life financially. (2) It was in Yenching where I came into contact with the finest Christian leaders in China: Dr. J. Leighton Stuart, Dr. T.C. Chao, Dr. T.T. Lew, Dr. J.F. Li, Dr. P.C. Hsu, Chancellor Wu Lei-ch'uan, and many other. The way I got to know Dr. P. C. Hsu was an accident. In a fellowship retreat where pastors and students were gathered, I happened to question about the sincerity of their faith in God, and what they really meant by it, stating that I myself was in a state of doubt and wanted to be sincere about it. Impressed by this naive sincerity, Dr. Hsu arranged to have a talk with me after the meeting. Henceforward, he acted as some sort of a spiritual guardian, and invited me to his home frequently. His was quite a different nature. His strenuous effort towards practical Christian life was greatly to be admired. From him I learned quite a great deal of the rational and practical side of Christianity. (3) It was in Yenching too where I got in touch with the best scholars and kind-hearted professors. To the above list, I may add Miss G. M. Boynton, Miss L. M. Burtt, Miss Nyfanwy Wood, Dr. H. S. Galt, Mr. B. N. Wiant, Dr. C. W. Luh, Prof.

William Hung, Dr. and Mrs. Sailer, Dr. Y. P. Mei, and Dr. Philip de Vargas. To Dr. T. C. Chao and Dr. Philip de Vargas I owe my education and spiritual assets most. I can not speak of them too highly. (4) It was in Yenching also that I got the inspiration to study in the School of Religion. A number of courses in Sociology in the university did not satisfy me. I turned to the study of education and psychology, taking education as my major, being anxious to do something really helpful and practical for my country. But towards the end of the senior year, it was gradually clear to me that "Education is the making of the soul", and that "Religion without education tends to become superstitious, while education without religion is useless." I wrote to Dr. Galt, quoting the above statements, telling him of my decision to study in the School of Religion. And I told it to my fellow students. Not a few of them were surprised, but I told them that the study of education was for others, and study of religion was for myself, and that I should strengthen my soul before I could educate others; religion itself will furnish me with sounder working philosophy. And I dare say that I got more out of the School of Religion in three years than I could get in the university in four. God has a special purpose for me. I must wait upon Him obediently. (5) lastly, It was in Yenching I married my wife, a graduate of the same university. This was in 1933, a year before I graduated from the School of Religion.

(12) Now, I must omit the experience in Tung-chou where I worked two years as a teacher and a religious worker, after my graduation from the School of Religion. The experience there was not very fruitful and interesting. I had wanted to do something more constructive and really helpful. I soon became restless and dissatisfied. I heard that Yenching was conducting a rural reconstructive program in Shantung on a large scale, and was enlisting graduated students for active service. Being offered a handsome scholarship for that purpose, I was accepted again as a student in the Graduate Division of the Department of Education, spending nine months in active study, and three months in visiting rural and educational centers throughout China, travelling through ten provinces. The Lu-kou-chiao incident broke out in July 7, 1937. On July the 8th the visitation group arrived at Hankow from the south. Hurrying to the North, we were stopped at Ting-hsien. It was not until July 21 that we got to Peking, only to see the Sino-Japanese war breaking out on the 28th. On the next day Peking was in the hands of the Japanese.

(13) The year from July 1937 to June 1938 I spent in thesis writing, feeling myself much depressed and uneasy. Seeing that nothing could be done for China under the Japanese occupation and that personal freedom and security were inevitably threatened, I decided to leave North China and go to the North West. I joined a little group under the leadership of Dr. Y. P. Mei, offering myself to serve my country and my people in a type of work for which I thought I was best fitted, regardless of personal discomfort. In July 1938, to the North West we went, by way of Tientsin, Hongkong, Hankow, and Sian. I left my family in Peiping. By August 5th, we were in Lanchou, Kansu, and there we started a new type of work that was to influence the life of the whole province.

(14) It would require a whole book, or at least a whole chapter, to describe the work we did and the experience we had in Kansu. For our purpose, I can only give a glimpse. The institution in which we worked was the Science Education Institute, Lanchow, Kansu, under the auspices of the Board of Trustees for the British Boxer Indemnity Funds. Dr. Mei was its first director, and I was in charge of the Social Education Division. Our main purpose was to promote science education in the schools, in the cities as well as in the villages, throughout the province. Our work consisted of two main parts: Scientific research and educational extension, under the names of the Natural Science Division and the Social Education Division respectively. Under the Natural Science Division, we had departments of Chemistry, Biology, Geology, Physics, agriculture, and a machine shop, conducting all sorts of research programs such as experiments on husbandry and cultivation, chemical analysis of natural resources of the

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province, the study of natural history, geology and geography, etc... Under the Social Education Division, we had a nurse, an agricultural extension worker, a worker on cooperatives, a research fellow, a general library, a circulating library, and a group of itinerant workers. The idea was to assist the promotion of science education through social educational means. The types of work we developed so far before I left may be summarised as follows: Teachers' Training Institutes, itinerant education programs, supervision of schools and of other educational activities, illustrated posters with short articles, a "Popular Science" publication, a circulating library, manufacture of simple scientific apparatus for use in the middle and primary schools, production and reproduction of scientific charts and illustrations, exhibitions, demonstrations of teaching, a central laboratory, cooperatives, broad-casting, summer schools, and so on and so forth. The work itself was altogether fascinating and constructive. And it was at once challenging and pioneering. We felt we were actually doing something creatively and constructively for the people and for the country. In fact it was the same social passion and Christian spirit that inspired me to enter into this work as that which had inspired me before. But this time it was more practical and solid, with an idea of self-denial and sacrifice. Because of the types of work we did, I had a chance to travel a lot, to visit the whole province, to mingle with the people and the school teachers, to have contact with the students and pupils of different grades, to meet officials and educational authorities, to see famous historical places, such as the Labrang Lamasery, the Tun-huang Caves, the Yu-men Oil Mine, etc. All these have helped me to see China, to know myself, to understand the Will of God more clearly.

15 After two years of service in the Science Education Institute, Dr. Mei was called by Dr. F. H. Kung to head up the reorganization work of the China Industrial Cooperatives (C.I.C.) headquarters in Chungking, and I, with a colleague of mine, decided to go to Labrang - a Tibetan area - to see what we could do for the border people. We got employed in the Labrang Vocational School, sponsored by the Ministry of Education. Later we were in charge of the People's Education Institute, sponsored by the Board of Trustees for the Boxer Indemnity Funds. The work and experience we had in this colorful, fascinating and mysterious Tibetan area of Labrang would also constitute a separate chapter of these "Reminiscences". To be brief, let me just give you some sort of an impression.

16 Labrang is a place full of cultural, religious and anthropological interest. It has a lamasery of 3,600 lamas, with some 108 small lamaseries under it within the area. The inhabitants are largely Tibetans, with some Mongols, living mostly on the "grasslands". Close to the Labrang Lamasery, there grew up in recent years a market town, in which there are Mohammedans and a small number of Chinese, and in which there resides the local government, controlled by the Chinese. In the vicinity there is a Christian church (of the Christian and Missionary Alliance). The missionary we met was a Mr. M. G. Griebenow. In his absence for half a year or more, we took charge of the church, and kept the church services going, I myself acting as a voluntary pastor. We also helped in the Girls School for the Tibetans, started by Mrs. Li An-che. We had many unforgettable experiences with pupils, both Chinese and Tibetans. I can still recall how they arranged a farewell party for me before I left, and how they came in procession and walked half a mile to see me off. I could not but feel sorry for them.

17 Most important of all, it was in Labrang that I felt the urge in me to become an ordained minister. The thing did not come all of a sudden. I felt the need somehow years ago, but I was so worldly minded at that time that I hesitated to be ordained, thinking that I could still serve God and my country in some other capacities. I thought as a Christian I could do a lot for my country all by myself without the help of God, of the fellow Christians or of the Church. But my experience during these years told me to the contrary. During these years of sacrifice and suffering and active service, I came to realize the limitations of human efforts

and capacities. I began to feel how weak we were spiritually. Salvation lies not in men, but in God to whom I must return. Individual conflicts and misunderstanding, personal hatred, pride and prejudices, political and social intrigues, worldly and materialistic considerations, the inward wickedness of human nature, as I saw them pass before my eyes, even among our own groups, could not but grieve me greatly. I got to distrust mankind. I did not even care to reveal myself to my friends because I thought they could not understand me. I wrote my wife who was in Peiping with her two children. But her comfort even was transient and temporary. I turned to God, in prayer for guidance and for help. I can still remember how during those nine lonely months in Labrang, I would get up early every morning, go down the river along the hillside, and throw myself down on knees among the bushes, crying out to God in agony these few words: "O God, help me to understand thy will. If it is thy will that I should stay in Labrang, open a way for my family to come and join me; if not, I pray that some other way be still opened for me." The prayer was answered, and God has a plan for me. I wrote to Dr. Stuart, asking if he would kindly take my family out when he had a chance to come down to Chungking. He wrote back, saying that it was not only unsafe but also very expensive for a family to travel in times of war, adding that it was easier for me to come up than for my family to go down. Soon afterwards, a letter came from the director of the Kansu Science Education Institute, asking me to go back and serve again in the Social Education Division of the Institute. I accepted his invitation, knowing that it was God's will that I should not stay in Labrang for long.

Coming back to Lanchow, I worked again for the Science Education Institute for another one and half years, not ceasing to pray to God more vehemently. On December 8, 1941, the Pacific war broke out, and on the 9th, Yenching was closed down by the Japanese. I had no news from my wife for three months after that until one day in March when I received a telegram from my wife in Sian, saying that she had taken her two children with her and escaped from Peiping through the Japanese line, and had arrived in Sian heading for Lanchow to join me. It was a great excitement and a great joy to us, for I had not seen my family for four years and had not heard of them for months. Thanks be to God that they arrived in Lanchow safely, and we joined joyfully in family life again.

A year before the Pacific War, an attempt had been made to secure me for the Border Service in Western Szechuan. I suspended my decision for months. And soon after the Pacific War and the close of Yenching, arrangement had also been made for me to help in the work of establishing Yenching in Chengtu. I also hesitated. I was not quite sure of God's will in either case. At last an invitation came from Dr. F. C. Hsu, asking me to help in an extensive program of translation of Christian literature. This invitation I quickly accepted, feeling that it was the type of work that God wanted me to do and I myself was much inclined to do it. Coming down from Lanchow to Chengtu, Szechuan, in August 1942, I had the direct contact with West China Union Theological College, in which I lived, taught, studied and did my translation work. (The works assigned to me for translation were selections from Origen's "Against Celsus" from the English, and Swatkin's "Early Church History".) In a vigorous way, I quickly refreshed myself in theological studies and systematic religious life. Within a year (1943), I was made an associate professor of Church History in West China Union Theological College. The next year (1944), I was appointed Dean of Studies. I felt quite at home in the college. I knew that God had called me back to His care and love, I worked and prayed and studied with the students day and night; I preached in the city and country churches; I helped in the schools; and in March, 1945, I was ordained a minister. I came to the decision because of the love of God, and because of the fact that through tempests and storms, and under the guidance and inspiration of God, I have come to realize that Christianity (i.e. ^{the} love of God, the love of Christ, and the love of humanity) is the only salvation for China and for the world. In June 1946, I was called back by Dr. T.C. Chao and Dr. Philip de Vargas to serve in the School of Religion and in the University, and was thus made a professor of Church History and University Chaplain. Knowing that it is God's will, I accepted the call and challenge most confidently and unhesitatingly. May God help me again that I may ^{be} worthy of the name.

Activities in my four years of work in the North West during the War have resulted in a number of articles published in local newspapers and institutional periodicals or magazines, which are too numerous to mention. I feel that the intellectual value of these four years has been very great, although the type of work and traveling did not allow me to do scholarly research.
 2. Translations of Origen's "Against Celsus" (selections, not yet published) and Gwatkin's "Early Church History" (Vol. I, ch. I-XII, not yet published).

 4. Lectures on Church History in general and also on the Reformation.

 - a. Christianity and the making of Christian character.
 - b. Christianity and the up-building of a new moral order for China.
 - c. Christianity as a new way and philosophy of life, a new social and political ideal, for young Chinese.
 - d. Christianity and the rebuilding of a new Chinese culture.
- III. New Testament as the basis of all Christian theology and as the record of the beginnings of the Christian Church.

Note: While abroad emphasis should be on I and III, aiming at study on II as a further stage.

Among the main contributions the Christian Colleges are making to China is their faculty members. For it is you teachers who are training China's future leaders.



From 1937 to 1941 I was in Kiangsi Province to participate the war program of the provincial Government: to help wounded soldiers, to conduct women education in the rural districts, to train woman leaders and local government workers, and to form organizations to take care of children in war areas. From 1941 to 1946 I was in Shanghai and taught in different universities as mentioned above in section No.7.

In 1938 when Kuling, the famous summer resort in Kiangsi Province, was about to fall to the hands of the Japanese, the Commissioner of Civil Affairs of Kaingsi Provincial Government and I went to Teh An (德安), situated at foot of Kuling Mountains, to make arrangements to evacuate refugees. A few minutes after our arrival, the Japanese came to bomb the town. Fire broke out everywhere, and many people were dea killed and wounded. We stayed in one of the brick anti-air raid shelters near the county government, and the Japanese ^{bombers} centered to bomb the county government offices. Our shelter was unable to sustain the heavy boming and began to crack widely. Every body in the shelter felt sure that the shelter would collapse, if the bombing continued a few minutes more. Fortunately the Japanese stopped bombing and we just had a chance to escape from the shelter.

In 1939 when Nanchong, the capital of Kaingsi Province, was attacked by the Japanese, I was in the city. I noticed that half of the city was entirely ruined. Besides bombing the gunfire came like raining. In the mid night we got the order information that our army was going to evacuate the city. Everybody tried to escape and all roads were jammed. inspite of heavy fighting. A few hours after I had left the city, it was completely occupied by the Japanese.







37. PLEASE TELL BRIEFLY ABOUT ANY UNUSUAL EXPERIENCES YOU HAVE HAD. FOR EXAMPLE, WERE YOU INTERNED, CAPTURED, BOMBED, ETC?

During the war years, I took part in a number of field expeditions at the request of the National Government and subsidized by the Harvard-Yenching Institute, the Rockefeller Foundation and other institutions, to collect data about the indigenous groups in Yunnan, Sikang and Szechwan, as a basis for policies of protection and development in a period of greatly increased contacts of these peoples with the outside world. In these expeditions, I had gone through many difficulties even at ^{the} risk of my life. I remember once when I was in the heart of Ta-liang-shan, the stronghold of the Independent Lolo tribes, a ferocious Lolo came to ask for some gift which I did not prepare. My translator tried in vain to convince him. At the top of his wrath, he levelled his gun and rushed over toward me, intending to do me harm. I was terribly frightened, but what could I do in such a strange land of aborigines! At the critical moment when my life was at the disposal of the ferocious man, there came my guarantor, a noble Black Lolo, who snatched away the gun from the rebellious man and pushed him aside. Thank Heaven, I was saved. Another incident happened to me is worth mentioning. In the summer, 1945, a student of mine and I went to the territory of the Giarung Native Chieftain, along the northern border of Szechwan and Sikang. One day we were lost in the forest of a high mountain where we had stayed for forty hours without food and sleep and suffered from cold, hunger, thirsty, fear, and what not. We were on the verge of collapse before we were found and rescued.

After the Closing of Yenching University, I stayed near Yenching as a farmer, did some farming, some translation work (such as Manson's Teachings of Jesus) and wrote a book on Confucianism, Taoism, Buddhism and Christianity. Each month I preached once in St. Mary's Church at Peking, and once in Wesleyan Church in Tientsin.

37. PLEASE TELL BRIEFLY ABOUT ANY UNUSUAL EXPERIENCES YOU HAVE HAD. FOR EXAMPLE, WERE YOU INTERNED, CAPTURED, BOMBED, ETC? I was captured by the Japanese Gendarmerie for a short ^(twenty minutes) time then was released. Afterwards the Gendarmerie told me he changed his mind feeling that there were sufficient men in Yenching captured. Later I was summoned to the Japanese Gendarmerie to answer the question whether the Oxford Groups were Communists. As chair man of the Christian Fellowship I had to find out. I did a piece of research work, went to Dr. Pyke telling him that the Japanese say ^{that} the Oxford Groups were Communists, what evidence you have to show that you are not. We made a thorough study from his study and found sufficient proof that the Oxford Groups were not Communists. The Japanese Gendarmerie was satisfied with the evidence so he never came back to trouble me again. Once I was riding on my bicycle by the side of a group of Japanese horse men, an auto-mobile came from the back. Before I could do anything, I was thrown from the road about twenty ^{or thirty} feet from the spot. Motionless yet conscious, I was lying by the side of the road. The Japanese officer came down from the auto, when he saw I was alive, he rewarded me with a slap on my face! Such was the Japanese Military! I could not forgive ^{him} then but I could forgive him after the Japanese were defeated, since I am a Christian.



was caught in Manila at the outbreak of the Pacific War. With my previous
credits I was admitted in 1942 as a regular student in the College of
Medicine of the University of Philippines. After the Battle of Manila in
February 1945 I served as an interne in the U. S. Army Emergency Hospital
until June when I was recalled to Chungking, then War-time Capital of China.
With the transferred credits I completed in 1946 my internship and all
the requirements for my M. D. degree from the National Hsiang-ya Medical
College.

Throughout the four years of Japanese occupation of the Philippines
from December 1941 to February 1945 I was free to move around in the city
of Manila as the Japs did not bother to intern the Chinese there. I
thoroughly enjoyed my life as a medical student in the University of the
Philippines but I suffered tremendously for not hearing from my folks in
China and for not having any money at all. Later I was fortunate enough
to meet some old friends who kindly arranged for me some loans from time
to time, finally amounting to a total of U.S.\$5,000.00, which I am unable
to repay until this day.

After the Landing at Leyte in November 1944 the military installations
in and around Manila were continuously subjected to bombing by the U. S.
forces. We all had to take cover during the bombing and to attend to
the numerous casualties in the hospital after the bombing.

During the Battle of Manila from February 13 to 17, 1945 the University
campus was used by the Japs as the main base for operation and our hospital
(Philippine General Hospital) was immediately made the target of the U. S.
bombardments. At nights the Japs set out to destroy sections of the city
systematically block by block with aerosols and dynamites and we were
therefore surrounded by fires. By February 15, practically all the roofs
and first floors of the hospital buildings were blown off by shells, leaving
only the concrete ground floors in tact. Most of us had to go down to
the basement and stay there three whole days without any food water and
sleep.

At noon on February 17 the U. S. tanks broke through the Hospital
entrance, forced the Japs to retreat and liberated the 14,000 of us,
survivors of the Hospital staff, students, patients and refugees. We
were escorted out to the suburb with bullets and shells still whistling
over our heads. We were taken by twenty or more trucks to a previously
set up Emergency Hospital of the U. S. Army where we were fed, clothed
and given the chance to attend to the war casualties from all over the
city. Not until then we realized that we actually survived this
horrible war.

36. WHERE WERE YOU AND WHAT DID YOU DO DURING THE WAR? I was serving as Assistant Governor of Shanghai Municipal Gaol, when War broke. I worked there until the foreign staff members went to the concentration camp. Then I left the Gaol service and joined the Sin Hwa Bank as General Secretary. It is a commercial bank in Shanghai. I worked there until Yenching asked me to come back to the University.

37. PLEASE TELL BRIEFLY ABOUT ANY UNUSUAL EXPERIENCES YOU HAVE HAD. FOR EXAMPLE, WERE YOU INTERNED, CAPTURED, BOMBED, ETC? _____

1. The most unusual experience I had was being a voluntary prisoner in the Peking Model prison. When I was a junior, I wanted to write a thesis of crime in Peking and was unable to get any available material. I suggested and got approval of the Chairman of the Department of Sociology that I would go to Jail to serve as a voluntary prisoner in order to get first hand information. I entered the jail in the summer of 1927. The first few days were so unendurable because of the mental conflict of wanting to be free and and of being unable to move. It was voluntary. I don't know how I would feel, when I ~~real~~ will be really locked up.

2. At the beginning of Japanese invasion in Shanghai I was working in the Shanghai Municipal Gaol, which was ~~the~~ in the middle of fighting. In front of the Gaol there were Japanese troops and in the back of it there were Chinese. The Gaol was bombarded for four days and we had more than one hundred casualties inside the Gaol. I did not sleep and went around the Gaol to save the prisoners who were either killed or wounded by shells and shrapnels. I was lucky that I was not hurt. I did not shave during these evantful days and have kept the moustache ever since.

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
